## **Claudeth Graduates in Law**

Claudeth is a genuine, intelligent young woman who speaks Shipibo as her first language.
Claudeth is the third of 10 children; she grew up in an indigenous village along the Ucayali River.
When Claudeth finished 10<sup>th</sup> grade, she traveled 500 miles to Lima, the capital of Peru, so she could work (to help her parents financially) and finish high school.

We spoke with Claudeth via cell phone when her sister, Dalixia, was working for us at the Ministry Center. Dalixia had told us about Claudeth's academic excellence and her dream of going to college. After we talked to Claudeth and reviewed her scholarship application, we realized she was a perfect fit for the scholarship program.

Claudeth's parents were reluctant to let their daughter go to college because they depended on her income. Their fears were relieved when we explained that the scholarship program would help them financially, as needed, while Claudeth was in college. The next month, our Benevolent Fund bought a house (\$2,182) for Claudeth's family, as well as bed frames and mattresses, so they would no longer have to sleep on the floor of their aunt's house. Claudeth's parents continued to work in agriculture to provide for their family.

During Claudeth's 7 years of college and Law School, our ministry helped Claudeth's family with food, clothing, school supplies, and Christmas gifts. Claudeth participated enthusiastically in scholarship retreats, Bible studies, and community service projects (see photo).

Now Claudeth works at a law firm. She dreams of bringing love and justice to her society, and especially to the marginalized indigenous people. In her most recent letter, Claudeth shared with her supporter, "I am writing this letter to you with great joy from work. Thank you very much for all these years of support. I will always be grateful to you and your whole family; you are a very special person to me."

# **Back-to-School Campaign**

The school year in Peru is from mid-March to mid-December. After two years of online classes, children are eager to attend in-person school. Parents are excited, but many of them are struggling to buy school supplies for their children.

Fortunately, churches, ministries, and individuals throughout the city are reaching out to these families. Our ministry has one



staff person and 8 trained volunteers who are identifying needy children and delivering supplies. These leaders have the joy of sharing the Good News with these families and offering to pray for them.

So far, 216 children have received school supplies, backpacks, and/or shoes from our ministry. The average cost is only \$32 per child (compared to \$50 in previous years) because school uniforms are not mandatory this year. Many of these children have a parent who is ill, deceased, imprisoned, separated or unemployed. We have given food boxes to some families; other families will receive building materials to make their homes safer and drier in the months to come. Thank you, donors!

Our staff and volunteers in Pucallpa are amazing! They have stepped into their leadership positions and are doing an excellent job running programs like benevolence, micro enterprise, evangelism, discipleship, college scholarships, orthotics and prosthetics, and drug rehabilitation.

In addition, the pastors and leaders of *Luz Divina* church (see photo) are flourishing in youth ministry, hospital and jail visits, prayer ministry, and outreach to satellite churches in the jungle.

# **Ministry Highlights**

Thanks to donors, over the last 3 months we have been able to:

- Donate a pediatric wheelchair for 12-year old Mia who was born with cerebral palsy (see photo).
- Buy a boat motor for Pastor Antonio from the Shipibo tribe so he can share the Gospel and distribute New Testaments to indigenous



villages in the jungle.

- Provide college tuition for 22 students.
- Cover critical medical expenses for 10 children and 8 adults.
- Buy 5 beds, 5 mattresses, 5 sets of sheets, and 5 mosquito nets for 7 family members who were sleeping on the floor.

### **Sulmira Walks Again**

Sulmira is a diabetic who lives at her friend's house in a poor area of the city. Two years ago, Sulmira developed an infection in her toe which spread to her foot and could only be controlled by the amputation of her lower leg. She visited Milton's workshop and shared, "My grown children cannot afford [to buy me a prosthetic leg]. I cried a lot, asking God to touch someone's heart to help me. I don't like sitting all the time. I like to be active. I want to go back to work."

Sulmira's children contributed \$113 (18% of the cost) toward the purchase of materials so Milton could build a leg for Sulmira. Donors helped with the remainder. Thanks to this team effort, Sulmira is walking again!



As we were leaving, a woman named Mississippi asked if we had any dry socks. Silas took off his socks and handed them to me. As I was holding out the socks for Mississippi, another



homeless woman kindly said, "I have extra socks that I can give her. Don't worry about giving her your socks." We were proud of Silas for having freely offered his socks.

We prayed for the woman on the spot, invited her to church, and handed her a \$20 bill. We were deeply moved by this experience.

Other recent family memories include: Liana jumping on a bungee trampoline for her 6<sup>th</sup> birthday and losing her first tooth; Silas playing laser tag with 7 of his friends for his 9<sup>th</sup> birthday; Jennifer serving as a substitute teacher for Silas's 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class; Mark taking a fabulous public speaking class online; and all four of us skiing on Mt. Hood with Jennifer's parents. We are in awe of God's grace that enables us to grow during different seasons of life.

When Mercedes first arrived, Jennifer asked excitedly, "So how is everything in Pucallpa?" Children and teenage girls are being kidnapped. It is not a good place to raise your kids now."

This was difficult for us to hear, but it also confirmed what we had been seeing and feeling the last few years that we lived in Pucallpa.

Our program director, Ruth, and her husband will be moving into the Ministry Center to run classes, meetings, and youth gatherings. The Ministry Center will also provide housing for visiting pastors and teachers who support churches and ministries in our region.
