Women's Drug Rehab Shelter Opens

This month, Pastor Roy and his wife, Rocio, finished the addition of a large bedroom and bathroom to their home so now they can help women who are addicted to drugs until the main women's rehab center is built. The inauguration of this shelter included a doctor and his staff who offered to help the women who would come to the shelter.

Within one week of the inauguration, five women (ages 14-35) had been enrolled in the drug rehab program. Pastora Rocio calls each woman her daughter (*hija*) and models God's love for them day and night. These women have begun to smile again, think more clearly, and have hope for restoring their relationships. Hallelujah!

Our Trip to Peru

Mark and Jennifer traveled to Lima, Peru at the end of March to renew our residential visas and to meet with our assistant, Ruth, and her husband, Gabriel (see photo). We are pleased that our Peruvian staff and volunteers are running the ministry programs without our physical presence in Peru. We also recognize the need for us to continue providing direction and oversight to them virtually.



Back-to-School Campaign

The school year in Peru runs from early March to mid-December. Each year, our staff and volunteers in Peru identify families who cannot afford to buy school supplies and uniforms for their children.

Charles and his three younger siblings are from one of these families. Their father traveled to the border of Brazil to work on a farm, but he has not called or sent any money yet. Their mother works washing clothes (by hand) and cleaning homes, but her income is barely enough to feed their family. Charles and his siblings were elated when they heard that they could go school shopping!

Thank you to donors who provided school supplies for 47 children, like Charles and his siblings. Without uniforms and supplies, these children would not have been allowed to attend school.

Alexandra's father was absent most of her life, so Alexandra lived with her elderly grandparents in a makeshift shelter behind their very small home. Her grandparents always hoped for something better for Alexandra.

The parents of one of our scholarship students offered to let Alexandra live with them if our ministry could build an extra room in their house. Alexandra loved the idea of being part of a family with four siblings, and Alexandra's grandparents were very grateful.

Our ministry helped Alexandra to:

- Build a room so she can study and sleep with privacy in her new home (\$442).
- Buy school supplies, a uniform, shoes, and a backpack so she can attend high school (\$79).
- Buy prescription eyeglasses so she can read the white boards at school (\$102).

Alexandra shares, "You have been a great blessing in my life. Thank you for giving me new hope." Thank you to donors for making this possible. We rejoice in this opportunity to serve!
