Mark Visits Pucallpa

In February, Mark and Jennifer flew to Lima, Peru to renew our visas. The following day, Jennifer flew back to the U.S. to take care of our kids, while Mark flew to Pucallpa to see our staff, volunteers, and college students.



Mark visited Milton at the Orthotics and Prosthetics (O&P) workshop. Milton continues to make high-quality prosthetic arms and legs for children and adults. Milton encourages the patients to contribute toward the cost of the prostheses, then donors cover the rest. Last year, we supported the fabrication of 8 prosthetic legs, thanks to generous donors!

Mark was impressed, as usual, by the love and care demonstrated by the leaders and interns at each center; they treat each other like family. Mark smiled as everyone called him Papá Mark (Daddy Mark), a nickname of endearment.

Children Go to School

The school year in Peru is from March to December. This year, we helped 55 children, for an average of \$34 per child, buy school supplies, backpacks, uniforms and/or shoes so they could attend school. Most of these children were identified by local pastors and young adults who sent us text messages asking for financial assistance for specific children. Thank you to our donors for making this possible!

Nerio needs a prosthetic leg

Current Needs

\$900 – Prosthetic leg for Nerio who is a farmer near the town of *Juanjuí*. His leg was amputated 11 years ago due to a serious infection. Since then, Nerio has been walking with a crutch (see photo) because he has not been able to afford a prosthetic leg.

\$190 – Wheelchair. We would like to buy 3 wheelchairs for future patients.

\$100 – Food box. We typically assist 1-2 families per week with food or rent.

\$75 – Medical care. We typically help 1-2 patients per week. In the last 3 weeks, we have helped a baby with pneumonia, a young girl with dengue fever, and a single mom with a serious dog bite. We also bought post-appendectomy medications for a woman from the Sharanahua tribe.

\$500 – Summer camps for our children, Silas and Liana.
